Dress Down Passes - Dress down passes have an expiration date. Please be sure to monitor the date on the pass so they don't expire before being used. When your child uses a dress down pass, it MUST be brought to school and handed to the leadership team upon arrival in the morning car line or they will be considered out of uniform.

PE Uniforms - Please be sure your child is wearing the appropriate PE shirt - the navy shirt with the school or lion logo. Other colors are not considered PE uniform shirts.

Aftercare Pick Up - We have been asked to remind those who pick up from aftercare to PLEASE park in a parking space behind the church near the artificial turf every time, not along the awning/sidewalk area when picking up. The Seton bus needs to drive through the area to pick up students from aftercare and it is not possible when cars are parked along the awning/sidewalk area. Catholic Faith Formation - *All Souls Day* - All Souls Day is a holy day set aside for honoring the dead. The day is primarily celebrated in the Catholic Church, but it is also celebrated in the Eastern Orthodox Church and a few other denominations of Christianity. The Anglican church is the largest protestant church to celebrate the holy day. Most protestant denominations do not recognize the holiday and disagree with the theology behind it.

According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven.

There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin." Additional references are found in Zechariah, Sirach, and the Gospel of Matthew. Jewish tradition also reinforces

this belief as well as the tradition and teaching of the Church, which has been affirmed throughout history.

Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven. <u>All Souls' Day - Saints & Angels - Catholic Online</u>
