Parent Survey for Our School Accreditation Retention - Thank you to those who have already completed the annual parent survey. We are asking at least one adult from each family to click this link: <u>eProveTM surveys</u> to complete the required annual survey by **Friday, 11/14**. All faculty and 3rd-5th grade students will be required to complete similar surveys as well. This is required for us to retain our accreditation status with Cognia. ESTF Grant - Please utilize this link: <u>2026-27 School Year ESTF Eligibility - SC School Choice</u> for all information related to the **26-27 ESTF (School Choice)** grant. This grant is for SC residents with students going into Kindergarten through 12th grades. All families who have children currently receiving the ESTF grant should have already applied for next year. If you have not done so, please do so today. For those not currently receiving the grant, please mark your calendars to apply on **Thursday**, **1/15/26**. This is a highly sought after grant and funds are limited, so please apply ASAP when the appropriate date for your family arrives.

- Nov. 1 Renewals for current recipients and siblings (must reapply with 2023/24 tax return).
- Jan. 15 Best date for all families to apply. Priority applications (active military and public-school students under 300% poverty).
- Feb. 9 Open to all applicants (up to 500% poverty level, IRS 1040 line 11).
- Award Amount (2026–27): \$7,634 per student. This is applied towards the actual cost to educate. Any difference is owed by the family. Our *current* CTE is \$7900.
- Families are typically notified within 2 weeks of applying and are to email the school immediately of the funds awarded.

Labeling Student Items - Please, please, please... label all of your child's items with his or her names. We find lots of clothing, water bottles, lunch bags, etc. without names and we don't know to whom they belong so we can't return them to their rightful owners.

Sunday's Readings - Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1: Malachi 3:19-20a

Lo, the day is coming, blazing like an oven, when all the proud and all evildoers will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire, leaving them neither root nor branch, says the LORD of hosts. But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 98:5-6, 7-8, 9: R. The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Sing praise to the LORD with the harp, with the harp and melodious song. With trumpets and the sound of the horn sing joyfully before the King, the LORD. **R.**

Reading 2: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Brothers and sisters: You know how one must imitate us. For we did not act in a disorderly way among you, nor did we eat food received free from anyone. On the contrary, in toil and drudgery, night and day we worked, so as not to burden any of you. Not that we do not have the right. Rather, we wanted to present ourselves as a model for you, so that you might imitate us. In fact, when we were with you, we instructed you that if anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat. We hear that some are conducting themselves among you in a disorderly way, by not keeping busy but minding the business of others. Such people we instruct and urge in the Lord Jesus Christ to work quietly and to eat their own food.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here— the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."
