Our students are learning about one virtue a month beginning in March. The first virtue we are focusing on is Prudence.

The virtue of Prudence - Prudence, the "mother" of all of the virtues, is the virtue by which a person recognizes his moral duty and the good means to accomplish it. Actually, prudence is part of the definition of goodness. A person can be prudent and good only simultaneously. No other virtue can contradict what is prudent. Therefore, what is prudent is substantially what is good, and prudence is the measure of justice, temperance and fortitude. A prudent person looks at the concrete reality of a situation with a clear, honest objectivity; references and applies the moral truths (e.g the Ten Commandments or the teachings of the Church); makes a moral judgment; and then commands an action. Moreover, prudence also seeks to accomplish the action in a good way doing what is good in a good way. Clearly, prudence is essential for the formation and operation of one's conscience. To be a prudent person, one must know God's truth, just as to have a good conscience, one must know God's truth. One cannot do what is good if one does not know the principles of truth and goodness.
