Happy Friday and happy Easter, HTCS families. Please see below for important information about the upcoming final weeks of the 24-25 school year.

First Communion for Catholic Second Graders - Students making their First Communion should attend the rehearsal that starts promptly at **6 PM** this evening, **Friday, 5/2**. Mass is scheduled for **11 AM** on **Saturday, 5/3**. We ask all families to gather at the Mary statue behind the church at **10:15 AM** Saturday morning for photos prior to the Mass. Please be on time as these photos must be taken before Mass in order to make it into the annual yearbook.

May Crowning - Please join us for our annual May Crowning of Mary which will take place after the **9 AM** school Mass on **Wednesday, 5/7**, behind the Church. A few notes:

- Second graders who made their First Communion on Saturday may wear their Communion clothing to school that day. They should bring a change of clothes for lunch and recess.
- All students are asked to bring in flowers for Mary that morning. They can be purchased or simply cut from your yard. No vases please. Students will bring the flowers to Mass and then they will place them on the wall in front of the statue of Mary during the service.

MAP Testing - Our final round of MAP testing for Kindergarten through 5th grade begins the week of **Monday, 5/5**. Please look for more specific details for when your child will be testing from their teachers.

Teacher Appreciation Week - We will be honoring our amazing faculty and staff between **Monday, 5/5 and Friday, 5/9**.
