No School - In recognition of Labor Day, there is no school on **Monday**, 9/2.

MAP Testing - The standardized MAP testing window opens for all 1st through 5th grade students on **Wednesday, 9/4**. Your child's teacher will let you know what days your child will be testing and a calendar has been posted on our school website. Please note... Kindergarten will not start MAP testing until January.

This Labor Day, let us recommit ourselves to building together a society that honors the human dignity of all who labor. Through the treasure of Catholic social teaching, we have a long history¹ of proclaiming the essential role labor plays in helping people to live out their human dignity.² Our Catholic faith calls us to pray, work, and advocate for protections that allow all laborers to thrive— both those newly arrived in our country and those whose families have been here for generations. We believe in the dignity of work precisely because each of our brothers and sisters is a beloved child of God, made in his own image and likeness, and imbued with inherent dignity. Throughout Scripture, we see time and again how God shows us we must care for those who are vulnerable and honor the sacredness of everyone—no matter his or her circumstances in life. In Matthew's Gospel,³ we read the parable of the workers in the vineyard as an example of the Father's overflowing love for each of his children. In that parable, the master pays all the workers a "just" wage despite working for differing lengths of time. Their remuneration is given simply because he desires that we all have the resources to thrive.⁴ Dignified work reflects that our humanity gives us an active role to play in cultivating the world around us. Through work, we exercise dominion over how we provide the material needs for ourselves and our families.⁵ God desires for us to do more than simply survive but to thrive.
