In the US, it is a Holy Day of Obligation and Mass attendance is required, therefore our first school Mass will be on Friday, 8/15, at 9 AM, and all students in Kindergarten through 5th grade will attend. Raising Lions from Mrs. Hines - The Importance of Attendance & Being on Time

At Holy Trinity, we believe that every day — and every minute — counts. When students arrive on time and attend regularly, they build important habits that lead to academic success, stronger relationships, and a greater sense of confidence in the classroom.

It might not seem like a few minutes here or there would make a big difference, but over time, those small moments add up. Here are a few eye-opening facts:

- Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to nearly 30 hours of missed instructional time over the course of a school year.
- Students who are frequently tardy are more likely to fall behind in reading and math, especially in the early grades when foundational skills are being built.
- Chronic tardiness can also affect a child's sense of belonging and participation, making it harder

for them to settle into routines and build friendships.

We know that life happens — and that occasional tardiness or absences can't always be avoided. Our goal is not to place blame, but to partner with you in building strong routines that help your child get the most out of their school experience.
