Catholic Faith Formation: Third Week of Advent: Otherwise known as the Shepherd Candle, this candle reflects the joy that comes through Jesus' arrival, and through the salvation he has gifted us. Christians may wonder why the church decided to make this particular candle a different color than the others. Although Christians have presented several reasons for the pinkish nature of the candle, from a tradition where priests would wear pink vestments to parents eagerly awaiting the joy of a child's arrival by painting the room pink, the rosy candle has its roots in something known as <u>Gaudete Sunday</u>. During this third week of advent, this Sunday celebrates the passage <u>Philippians 4:4-5</u>, its verses extolling readers to "rejoice" for "indeed the Lord is near."
