I'm happy to share some exciting news related to our on-going efforts to provide a safe and nurturing environment for our students. We recently received approval to have permanent fencing installed around the outside play area behind the church. The work should begin in the next few weeks and, once completed, will prevent cars and people from accessing the play area during school hours.

- MAP testing Our students are doing an amazing job with the standardized MAP testing. So far, students in Kindergarten, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> have completed their assessments. This week, students in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> will be testing, and we will be conducting make up tests for any students who were absent on their original test days. Teachers use the data gathered from these assessments to set goals with their students. They will share all this information with you at our parent-teacher-student conferences in October.
