What are Paw Coins?

Paw coins are positive reinforcement currency. Students earn paw coins by demonstrating good ROAR behavior. Students will have a paw pouch in which to keep their coins. This pouch remains at school as they accumulate their coins. They may save or spend paw coins in the ROAR Store. Throughout the year there will be special ROAR events which will celebrate good ROAR behavior. Students who have earned the designated number of paw coins will be eligible to attend these ROAR celebrations.

Respectful

- Speak kindly
- Get permission to use someone else's things
- Work quietly

Appropriate

- Treat others the way you want to be treated
- Do vour best

Responsible

- Be on time and ready to learn
- Follow directions
- Ask for help
- Complete assignments on time and bring to school

Hallway

Respectful

- Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself
- Move silently and stay in your place in line

Organized

- Keep up with your class
- Know where you are going and what you need to do
- Carefully hold your belongings

- Walk and stay to the right of the hall
- Greet and/or respond to greetings quietly and politely
